

Trading Card Activity Directions

Materials:

- projector to model baseball card of favorite players
- Chromebooks
- Textbooks
- 4x6 index cards cut in half to the size of an actual baseball card

I. Analyze features of a trading card which will serve as a model to you showing what a quality card looks like.

II. In your groups, draw a name from a hat at random from the list of Federalist and Anti-Federalist.

III. Create a vintage baseball trading card for your "Founding Father" using information found in the textbook (p. 212-221) as well as from alternate relevant sources on the web (<http://www.readwritethink.org/classroom-resources/student-interactives/trading-card-creator-30056.html?tab=4#tabs>),

IV. Choose roles for each group member. There will be 3-4 students in each group.

- The **analyst** will research the information using their text and/or Chromebook.
- The **recorder** will write down the factual information learned and write it on the card.
- The **illustrator** will design the card either digitally using a Trading Card generator app <http://www.readwritethink.org/classroom-resources/student-interactives/trading-card-creator-30056.html?tab=4#tabs> or Google Slides. Alternatively, student may choose to illustrate their card on an index card using their art supplies.
- The **orator** will share the player's "stats" to learn about other groups, and initiate trades with other groups.

V. Cards should include the following information:

- Bottom right of card* should include **Copyright Logo, Student Names, Printed in 7B**
- Bottom center of card should include delegate's **political party**.
- *Center of card* should include **illustration** of delegate
- *Back of card* should include "Stats" which list **Birth date, Where are they from, their political experience, their "batting average" and special abilities, their goals and accomplishments at the convention, and their political views** (Federalist or Anti-Federalist).

Constitutional Convention Baseball Trading Card Rubric

Information: The back of each card includes detailed and accurate information about the subject. Research is thorough and complete.

4 Points: All information and “stats” are clear, detailed, and completely accurate.

3 Points: One piece of information is unclear or inaccurate

2 Points: Some information is unclear or inaccurate

1 Point: Little information is detailed or accurate.

Artwork: The front of each card is illustrated neatly and colorfully. The subject and political party of the card is clearly titled and labeled.

4 points: Excellent artwork or images, and clear labels.

3 points: Project shows good effort

2 points: Project shows acceptable effort

1 point: Little effort shown on artwork

Creativity:

2 points: The trading card is original and imaginative

1 point: Acceptable effort and creativity shown
